Terrie Ashbaugh, Conductor

Terrie Ashbaugh has been a professional musician for over 50 years. She received her BA in piano performance from Seattle Pacific University and masters in choral conducting from the University of Arizona under Maurice Skones. In addition to conducting, she composes and arranges choral music and has been a strong advocate for choral music through her involvement in various organizations.

Terrie has directed the Arizona Women's Chorus (formerly the Southern Arizona Women's Chorus) since 1998. Prior to AWC, she directed two preparatory and training choirs — the Columbia Boys Choir and the Columbia Girls Choir — which consistently won top awards at the concert level; the Kirkland Choral Society in Kirkland, Washington; and music ministries at several churches in the Seattle area. In Arizona, she formed the UA's faculty/staff choir as an independent chorus after the choral conducting program disbanded it. Terrie has had the privilege to direct on the stage alongside Rene Clausen, Kirby Shaw, and Rollo Dilworth.



Peter Tiboris, Conductor

As General and Music Director of MidAmerica Productions in New York since its founding in 1983, Mr. Tiboris has presented more than 1,400 concerts worldwide, including in Carnegie Hall and at other New York City venues. In 2004 he founded MidAm International, which produces concerts in major European cultural centers including Paris, Vienna, Salzburg, Florence, Lisbon, Prague, Berlin, Warsaw,

Athens, Moscow, and St. Petersburg. In 2005, he created the International Festival of the Aegean on the Greek island of Syros in the Cyclades where he presented international-caliber performances of opera, oratorios, concerti, symphonic works, Greek folk music, jazz, theater and ballet. In 2011, the Festival was named "Best cultural organization operating in the wider region of Greece" by the Awards Committee of Music Critics of the Union of Greek Theatre and Music Critics in Athens. Among the distinguished orchestras, Mr. Tiboris has conducted are London's Royal Philharmonic and Philharmonia Orchestras, Niedersächsische Orchester Hannover, Virtuosi di Praga, Brno Philharmonic, National Opera Orchestra of Cairo, American Symphony Orchestra, Moscow Radio and Television Symphony Orchestra, Société Philharmonique de Montréal, Israel Symphony Orchestra Rishon Le-Zion, Orchestra del Teatro dell'Opera di Roma, Orchestra di Verona, and Orchestra di Siciliana di Palermo.

Grange Festival, Isabella L'italiana In Algeri at the Opera de Tenerife, Teatro Comunale di Bologna and the Centre Lyrique Clermont-Auvergne, Magd in Zemlinsky's Der Zwerg at Ópera de Tenerife, Ottavia L'incoronazione Di Poppea at the Longborough Festival and Alcina Orlando Furioso and Aristea in Vivaldi's L'olimpiade conducted by Federico Maria Sardelli. Upcoming engagements include her role-debut as Mme Arvidson Un Ballo In Maschera for Chelsea Opera Group and 3rd Wood Nymph Rusalka for Opera de Tenerife. Recent concert appearances include Berlioz Les Nuits d'Ete at the Festival de Múver and Les Noces with the London Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Vasily Petrenko.



Edward Lee, Tenor

Edward Lee received his Bachelor and Master of Music with honors from the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London. He was a member of the ensemble at the City Theater Pforzheim, the Music Theater in Revier Gelsenkirchen, and the Landesbühnen Sachsen. As a guest singer, he has performed at theaters in Aachen, Gießen, Magdeburg, Lübeck, and Hagen, as well as at the Tyrolean State Theater in Innsbruck. Engagements in the UK include performances at the Aldeburgh

Festival, English Touring Opera, Grange Park Opera, Lontano Ensemble, St. Martin-in-the-Fields, and Opera North. Among his previous roles are Acis in Handel's Acis and Galatea, Alfred in Johann Strauss II's Die Fledermaus, Caramello in Johann Strauss II's Eine Nacht in Venedig, Count Almaviva in Rossini's II Barbiere di Siviglia, Don Ottavio in Mozart's Don Giovanni, among many others.



Per Bach Nissen, Bass

Danish bass Per Bach Nissen's recent engagements include Jens Grand in Heise's Drot og Marsk for Royal Danish Opera, Wirt in Schreker's Der Schatzgräber at Opera National du Rhin, and two roles for Salzburg Landestheater - King René in Tchaikovsky's Iolanta, and Rudolf Kaiser in the World premiere of a new opera by Alma Deutscher, Des Kaisers Neue Walzer. He returned to the Royal Danish Opera in the 21-22 season as Il Sagrestano in Puccini's Tosca. Other recent

THE ARTISTS



Keith Jones, Conductor

Keith Jones is Professor of Music at Converse, where he is a Professor of Music, Director of Choral Activities, Music Director for the Opera program, and a past Music Director for the Musical Theatre program. Throughout his professional life tenor Keith Jones has brought distinction to his performances in opera, oratorio, and recital. He has sung with Opera Omaha, Newberry Opera, Palmetto Opera, Opera Lite of

Hilton Head, Indiana University Opera Theatre, Converse Opera, and in Boris Goldovsky's Opera Scenes Program with the San Antonio Young Artists Festival. He also has sung concert versions of opera and operetta throughout South Carolina and has performed on Three Tenors concerts with the Charleston, Columbia, and Spartanburg symphonies. Keith Jones has been the tenor soloist for Bach's St. Matthew Passion, St. John Passion, Christmas Oratorio, and Magnificat; Beethoven's Ninth Symphony and Missa Solemnis; Britten's War Requiem and Saint Nicolas; Mendelssohn's Elijah; Mozart's Requiem and Coronation Mass; Monteverdi's Vespers of 1610; Orff's Carmina Burana; Vaughan Williams' Hodie and Serenade to Music; and Verdi's Requiem.



Bryson Mortensen, Conductor

Bryson Mortensen is Director of Choral Activities at Virginia Wesleyan University and Artistic Director of the Virginia Choral Society. Previously he was Artistic Director of the Festival Choir of Madison, where he premiered more than fifteen works by living composers in four years, and Director of Choral Activities at the University of Wisconsin Rock County where he brought the UW-Rock County Jazz Singers

to perform at the Wisconsin Choral Directors Association convention. Bryson has worked with living composers such as Andrew Maxfield, Joshua Harris, Timothy Takach, Abbie Betinis, Nathan Howe, Eric William Barnum, and Paul Carey. In addition, Bryson has been a guest conductor for All-District Choruses and Festivals across the country. He has led tours to Virginia, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, and Pennsylvania. Bryson has conducted the premieres of Andrew Maxfield's "Armistice Sonnets," Timothy Takach's "The Longest Nights," and Joshua Harris' "There will be stars over this place forever," which was performed at the grand opening of the Susan S. Goode Fine and Performing Arts Center.



KuanFen Liu, Conductor

KuanFen Liu has profoundly shaped the performing arts community since she arrived in California in 1999. She was instrumental in forming the Channel Islands Chamber Orchestra, and the Channel Islands Choral Association – with both groups advancing her vision to nurture the next generation of musicians. As the Artistic Director and Conductor of both organizations since their inceptions, KuanFen has created unique

concert series with innovative programming, commissioned new works from local composers, and initiated outreach and mentorship programs in Ventura County school districts. The most recent example of KuanFen's achievements occurred in the summer of 2022, when KuanFen led a 108-member choir – primarily of Ventura County singers aged 14 to 80 – and the New England Symphonic Ensemble in a performance at Carnegie Hall. KuanFen is an Associate Professor in Music at CSU Channel Islands University. Originally from Taiwan, KuanFen began musical studies at the age of five. She is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music and Thornton School of Music at the University of Southern California.



Holly Brown, Soprano

Holly Brown is a soprano studying at the Guildhall School under John Evans. Previous opera and theatre roles include Pamina in Mozart's Die Zauberflöte, Maria in Respighi's Maria Egiziaca, Miranda in The Enchanted Island and Elaine in George Gershwin's Crazy for You and La Fata Verde in Respighi's La bella dormente nel bosco. On the concert platform she has performed Mozart's Exultate, Jubilate, and as a soloist in Orff's Carmina

Burana, Vivaldi's Gloria and Rossini's Stabat Mater. She is a reciepient of the Sidney Perry Foundation grant.



Maria Schellenberg, Mezzo-soprano

Maria Schellenberg (formerly Ostroukhova) is a London based mezzo-soprano of Jewish-Armenian background. She began her international career after winning the Michael Oliver Prize at the London Handel Competition in 2015.
